Kede, Transylvania (Chedia Mare and Chedia Mica, Romania)

Kiskede (Chedia Mare) and Nagykede (Chedia Mica) are both located at the end of a road. A hill separates the two villages and the church that serves them both is built on that hill. The Kede congregation has few members but in beautiful surroundings and with warm-hearted people.



There are no shops and no working opportunities. Their lifestyle on small farms is totally self-sustainable. They are hardworking people that have captured the heart of their minister. Some families who own property there live in the nearby town and return on weekends to farm.

Rev. Moldovan Szeredai says *“In a world where Unitarianism is in the minority it gives great force to know that there are Unitarians on the ‘other’ side of the world, who think in many ways the same and share the most important Unitarian values.”*
