Székelyszentmiklós in Transylvania (*Nicoleni, Romania*)

Székelyszentmiklós is a small village with about 60 people nestled in the rolling hills between Székelykeresztúr and Székelyudvarhely.



Most of the people are older the few children go to school in a nearby town. Fifteen percent of the villagers are Roma, the rest are ethnic Hungarians.

They do have electricity, but water is pumped from wells. There is no water distribution system. The villagers are mostly subsistence farmers with a few cows, goats and sheep. Many of them are living on their government retirement pension.

The minister, Rev. Attila Zoltán Pitó, lives in the village of Tarcsafalva. He ministers to both Székelyszentmiklós and Tarcsafalva. He conducts worship services twice a month and on holidays in Székelyszentmiklós. He speaks Hungarian, Romanian, English and German.

The minister writes *"They would like common programs or projects."*

The villagers would like to be in contact and would like visitors from their partner church.
